ABOUT THE ROLE

Wen is looking for a dynamic and experienced coordinator with a passion for community gardening and the importance of green spaces to lead our local food growing, nature and health projects.

This role will coordinate a small but vital network of community food growers in Tower Hamlets sharing skills and resources. Previously known as the Tower Hamlets Food Growing Network, Wen have been building the network since 2010 running workshops, practical support and four immensely the popular seasonal gatherings each year that have become a thriving space for people to share their passion for growing. We advocate for the importance of green spaces for health and well-being, support groups that want to grow on vacant land and equip people with the skills to grow.

As Green & Grow Coordinator you will work collaboratively with communities and groups to support and promote the value of community led greening project, gardening and food growing as a way of taking local action on global issues. You will bring the network together to share ideas and skills at regular seasonal gatherings, support the development of news spaces and deliver social and therapeutic horticulture programmes and organic gardening courses.

The networks developed across Tower Hamlets around food growing is a vital part of our work shaping a just and sustainable local food system for Tower Hamlets. During the pandemic communities have been more committed to growing local food than ever. Since 2018. We've led the borough's Food Partnership, which coordinates organisations and individuals to take collective action for a better food system in Tower Hamlets. We've also just launched a five-year programme of community climate action on our food system: Just FACT (a Just Food and Climate Transition for Tower Hamlets).

- Coordinate and develop the successful network of community led food growing activities, bringing new community groups, gardening projects, local nature based health and wellbeing organisations and passionate gardeners to the network
- Increase participation, build capacity and facilitate skills sharing across the network by developing responsive training and workshops about food growing and therapeutic gardening
- Support residents to get involved in existing or new community growing projects
- Build relationships with partners and stakeholders including Public Health, Local Authority, NHS and various Registered Social Landlords (RSLs) and explore new partnerships with community food projects and corporate responsibility programmes.

Building power and collaborative working

- Co-create a policy agenda with the network around land use and the importance of greening/growing projects to health & well-being, air quality and reducing the borough's carbon emissions
- Explore how network members can support each other through, for example, sharing tools, resources and seeds.
- Organise occasional small community garden developments and practical support
- Develop funding and contract bids in collaboration with line manager

Events and communication

- Co-Create and run seasonal public facing events with network members
- Send regular newsletters and create new website content e.g. blogs, resources
- Maintain the directory of local growing spaces and network mailing list

Essential Experience

- At least 1 year's project coordination experience
- Working with community groups to deliver training, workshops, events or network building
- Interest or skills in gardening, community greening or food growing
- Solid knowledge of issues around land use and the benefits of greening and growing
- Excellent communication skills, the ability to disseminate information to a wide range of audiences across platforms e.g. social media, newsletters, websites
- Experience of working alongside communities or vulnerable groups such as older people, youth groups, people with mental health issues or BAME women's groups
